## 2. Key Centre Policies

- Centre Priorities/Statement of Purpose: Our core belief is that 'children are at the centre of everything we do'. Our Statement of Principles document covers our guiding principles in regards to children, families, community, colleagues and curriculum.
- Site policies are divided into five categories: Curriculum, Health and Safety, Human Resources, Management of Service and Work Health Safety. These policies cover both Department policies (including those required by Regulation 168) and site specific policies.

 Director: 1.0 (role shared between 2 staff, 1 0.6 and the other 0.4)  
 Preschool teachers: Three PS teachers 0.6, One full-time teacher in the Long Day Care program

 Long Day Care Staff: Approx 40 employed in full time, part-time or casual work
- Performance Management Program: Staff (under the management of the Director) meet with their immediate line manager every six months. The main emphasis of performance management is the constructive use of people's

strengths to identify opportunities for improvement at a site level in addition to personal professional goals, empowerment and encouragement to learn new skills.

- Access to special support staff: Bilingual workers are employed as needed to support children with EALD and visits are often coordinated with Department for Education special educators, psychologist, speech pathologist and occupational therapists to observe children to provide support.

## 5. Centre Facilities

- Buildings and grounds

*Our Centre shares the grounds with the Forbes Primary School. The site was officially opened at the end of 2010 and in December 2020, the site marked its tenth anniversary. There are 3 childcare spaces with one room for children aged 0 – 2, one for children 2 – 3 ½ and an integrated long day care and Preschool room for children aged 3 ½ to school age. The 0 -3 spaces share an outdoor space and the Preschool/Pre-kindy space have their own outdoor play area. There are also several office spaces for community services, leadership and admin staff.*

- Capacity (per session): Preschool: 22 children each day (full day sessions 8:00am to 4:00pm with a lunch care session, Monday/Tuesday and Thursday/Friday), whole site capacity each day is 90 children (15 in 0 – 2 space, 25 in 2 – 3 ½ space, 50 in 3 ½ to school age space – inclusive of children attending Preschool)
- Centre Ownership: site is owned by Department for Education
- Access for children and staff with disabilities: Ramp access to community side (where there are stairs), both childcare/preschool side and community side have accessible toilets.

## 6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

- General characteristics:

In the Edwardstown, South Plympton, Plympton Park and Ascot Park area there are many houses 50-60 years old. Recently a number of these have been demolished and new townhouses/units built. There are many rental properties with a high proportion of housing trust rental. The area is also popular for new arrivals or students and so many families speak languages other than English with Arabic, Hindi and Mandarin being the main primary languages.

The majority of families attending our services are from Plympton, South Plympton, Edwardstown, Melrose Park, Ascot Park and Park Holme. Due to number of services available at the site, we often receive referrals or interest from families in other suburbs also.

- Parent and community involvement in the preschool: Parents are encouraged to volunteer their time and skills in the Preschool. We have a community

volunteer who shares story time and books with Preschool children twice a week.

- Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool: Our main feeder school is Forbes Primary School, but many children attend other schools in the area including Plympton Primary, Plympton International College and Emmaus.
- Other local care and educational facilities: Forbes Primary School, Ascot Park Kindergarten, Plympton South Kindergarten
- Commercial/industrial and shopping facilities: Close to Forbes Shopping Complex
- Other local facilities: Chemist, supermarket are close by
- Availability of staff housing: *Not applicable*
- Accessibility: In Metropolitan area
- Local Government: City of Marion
